Burnaby care homes get ticket to freedom

Donors who contributed to the purchase of a care home's private shuttle were invited to its maiden voyage

this past Wednesday.

Since fundraising began in 2010, the Normanna care home and its sister facility, the Dania home, were both able to raise the \$130,000 needed to purchase the bus, named The Spirit of Freedom.

"The donors from both houses are very loyal (and give very generously," said Myrna Latval, president of the board of directors,

about the fundraising. The idea for a private shuttle arose from a need that exceeded what services like HandyDART provide, according to Latval. The new transport can carry up to 16 passengers and includes facilities to safely secure numerous wheelchairs.

The bus is also a key element of the two homes' Outreach program, where home-bound seniors "can be brought to our facilities to enjoy a nutritional meal, participate in social events and enjoy camaraderie," according to a press release. The goal of the outreach program is to prevent isolation in seniors who may be unable to reach either the Normanna or the Dania on their own.

Piloting the newly christened shuttle on a tour to New Westminster's Queen's Park last week was driver-by-day and singer-by-night, Kiel Magis.

With his Mohawk stylishly coiffed, the 25-year-old livened the ride with his dry wit and even broke out in song on occasion.
